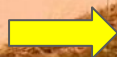

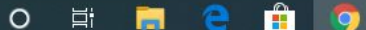

Lift

Grade Level: 3-56-8

Gravity pulls a plane toward the earth, but lift helps it stay in the air. Learn about Bernoulli's principle. You could keep a ping-pong ball in the air with a hair dryer, but it will fall to the ground if gravity overcomes lift. If the forces of lift and gravity are equal, it will stay the same distance from Earth. The shape and angle of an airplane's wind splits airflow, creating a low pressure area above the wing. An airfoil shape is aerodynamic, and air travels faster over the wing than under it.

A Change in the Winds: Studying Bernoulli's Principle

Grade Level: 6-89-12

For a science fair project that is both simple and fun, try this one about air pressure. You can make objects come together by blowing air between them. The introduction to the project explains Bernoulli's principle and how it works with race cars and airplanes. Understand the relationship between velocity and the pressure exerted by a moving fluid. There is a short list of necessary supplies and directions and photos explaining how to do the experiment.
